

# Dermatology care *study days or module*

St. John's Institute of Dermatology in collaboration with King's College London are pleased to announce a new 15 credit, degree level module in dermatology care. This module will offer primary and secondary care practitioners an opportunity to further develop their knowledge and skills in the assessment, therapeutic interventions and care required for individuals with skin disease. Eight themed study days will be provided: assessing the patient with a skin problem and dermatology pharmacology and prescribing will be core. In order to meet individual practice needs students will also be able to select a further four study days from the following: skin cancer, long term conditions, paediatric dermatology, emergency dermatology, rare dermatological conditions and supportive care and symptom management in order to complete the module.

<b>6 February</b>	Skin cancer
<b>13 February</b>	Supportive and symptom management
<b>20 February</b>	Paediatric care
<b>27 February</b>	Emergency and acute care
<b>5 March</b>	Rare condition
